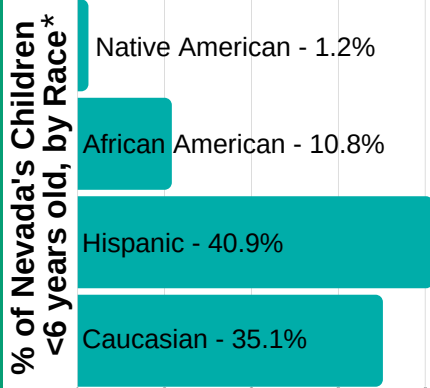
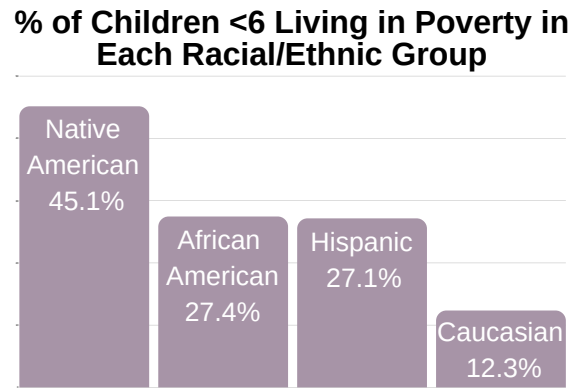

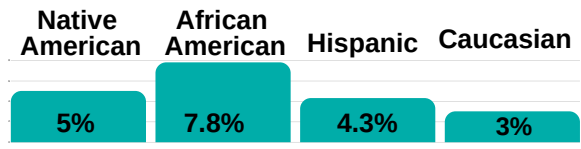

In 2016, **213,835** children under age 6 lived in Nevada and **44,154** of those lived in poverty, but poverty impacts some communities more than others.

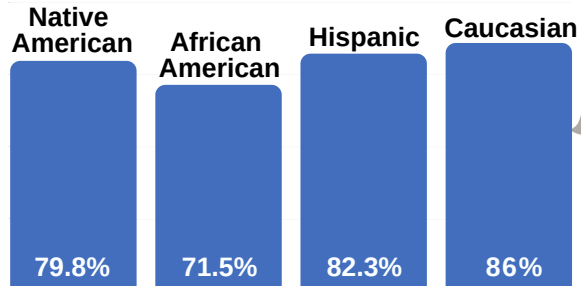


Nevada Grade 12 Dropout Rates, by Race



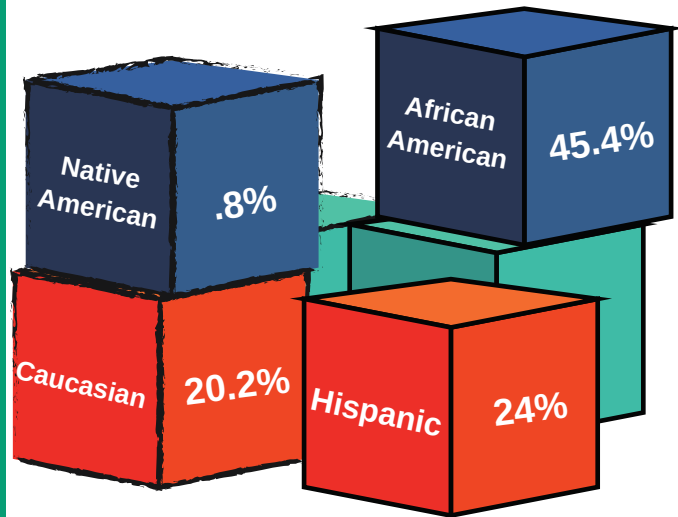
Nevada's Average Dropout Rate is 3.9%

Nevada Graduation Rates, by Race

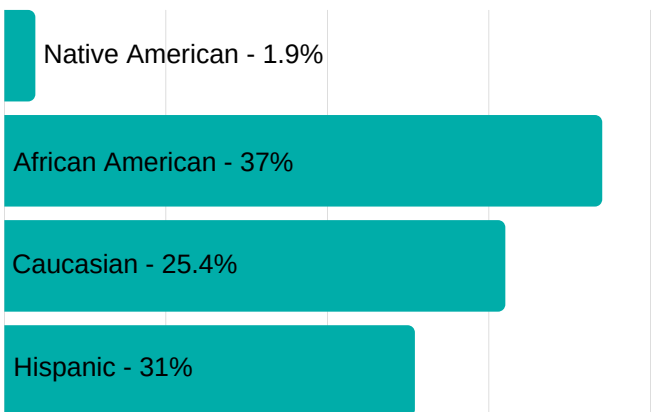
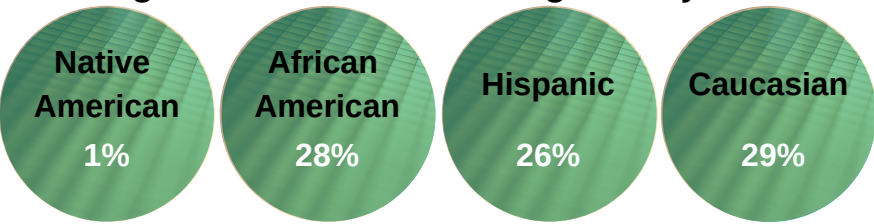


80.9% Nevada's Average Graduation Rate
