



Pritzker Children's Initiative Overview


The Pritzker Children's Initiative (PCI) supports grantees nationwide as they develop and implement comprehensive, universal systems with targeted strategies to reach families furthest from opportunity as an effect of systemic/institutional racism and poverty.

PCI champions the creation and expansion of a national movement to increase investment in universal and targeted PN-3 services and supports to infants and toddlers and their families, beginning prenatally

The Pritzker Children's Initiative grant funds the work of the Strong Start PN-3 coalition to produce data driven policy recommendations, strategies, and support the implementation of effective and equitable policies that ensure all children thrive from the start.






Pritzker P-3

- Opportunity to share stories that shape their "why" for advocacy.
- Learn about the legislative process, and develop skills to strengthen advocacy efforts to create a collective impact.
- Meetings are held monthly
- Stipends are provided following each meeting to honor the time of all participants.


