5. The Development of Nevada Early Childhood Language Access Plan (Information/Discussion)

The Council heard an update regarding the Nevada Early Childhood Language Access Plan Rachel Stepina, Grant Manager, Preschool Development Grant Birth through Five

• Rachel Stepina provided visual presentation for segment with a QR code with explanation for 'interactive presentation' using mobile device access.



- Rachel Stepina discussed the importance of language access, including definition of language access via
 Civil Rights Act of 1964 and its role in comprehensive service provision, as well as the types of resources
 available to assist with language access plans.
- Rachel Stepina discussed foundational policy for the role of language access and the assessment of organizations to fulfill this need. There are multiple language access plans available, as well as the services available to support the effort.
- Rachel Stepina next steps for improving Early Childhood Language Access like having state-specific data, identification of overlap and gaps among existing plans, communication among early childhood groups within Nevada, and more.
- Rachel Stepina recommended self-assessment questions & reflection, participation in development of early childhood Language Access Plan, and learning about other variables surrounding language access and family developmental needs.

6. Gap Analysis and Revenue Plan update (Information/Discussion)

The Council heard a review of the Gap analysis and an update on the revenue plan Denise Tanata, Early Childhood Comprehensive Systems Consultant, The Children's cabinet Kyle Wheeler, The Children's Funding Project Bruno Showers, The Children's Funding Project, State Revenue officer

- Bruno Showers provided visual presentation for segment titled 'Nevada: State-Level Revenue Options.
- Bruno Showers reviewed federal de- obligations and the amount of revenue across program, Money
 allocated and sent back to the federal government because of not being utilize. He mentioned
 Medicaid stands out of money being sent back and notable to investigate the topic in relation to acquiring
 more early childhood support.
- Bruno Showers discussed Capital Gains Tax and how it can serve as a substantial form of support for additional funding.
- Bruno Showers discussed Reformed Modified Business Tax and how the elimination of exemptions and raising of rates can raise revenue.
- Bruno Showers- discussed the reform of Real Estate Transfer Tax and the taxing of real estate transactions, higher rates for higher value properties mentioned as an option of interest.
- Bruno Showers Discussed reform of Commerce Tax, consolidate rates lowering sales thresholds
- Bruno shared a state level options comparison in each area mentioned.
- Bruno Showers- we will be working we Denise Tanata to find out what options we want to explore in the future.
- Kylie Wheeler provided visual presentation for segment titled 'ECE System Gap Analysis'
- Kylie Wheeler difference between 'what is needed' and 'what organizations have' to find the 'gap' for organizations.
- Kylie Wheeler described the Gap Analysis is to fund an implementation goal with a set of clear and measurable objective.
- Kylie Wheeler shared a list of program area sectors that are being considered for gap analysis, highlights certain topics that have been investigated prior.
- Kylie Wheeler discussed phase-in approach to accomplishing goals and applying strategies related to program access.



- Kylie Wheeler presented examples of multi-level goals focused on sustained funding plans.
- Kylie Wheeler 'Level 1 Gap Analysis for Childcare Assumptions, around the topics of eligible populations, care settings, and enrollment conditions for early childhood education.
- Kylie Wheeler- Discussed follow-up steps and the importance of finalizing assumptions to assist with gap analysis needs.
- Dr Linda Young inquired about how data is disseminated among stakeholders.
- Denise Tanada- discussed development of dissemination plan once significant data is decided with group's interest in mind.

7. Prenatal to 5 Fiscal Strategies/Maternal Methodology (Information/Discussion)

The council heard a presentation

Karissa Loper Machado, Agency Manager, The Children's Cabinet

- Karissa Loper Machado discussed foundation of presentation, the current survey used to determine subsidy rates to support families, and the importance alternative cost models and cost analysis.
- Jeanna Capito -alternative cost methodology that is in development.
- Jeanna Capito concept of 'cost models' Tool to understand the cost of providing services.

Jeanna Capito - the importance of cost model tool because of its ability to estimate costs of providing services, demonstrating impact of multi-source funding, identifying gaps between costs and revenue sources, and the utilization various datasets and datapoints.

- Jeanna Capito- how cost model helps explain different functions of organizations and their capacities like mandatory employer taxes, coverage for breaks, health and safety standards, cost drivers associated with quality levels and non-personnel expenses.
- Jeanna Capito the different scenarios that the presentation will review regarding the cost model.

- Jeanna Capito discussed salary points and the comparison between local and statewide conditions.
- Jeanna Capito costs to serve different early childhood age groups across Nevada counties in comparison to statewide data.
- Jeanna Capito reviewed-Annual Cost Per Child values across various industry variables.
- Dr Linda Young commented about wage comparisons and concerns regarding sustainable childcare services.
 In response to Dr Linda Young, Jeanna Capito discuss vacancy, turnover, and retention concerns with childcare field.
- Carrie Paldi inquired about rate applications in cost model study.
- Karissa Loper Machado need to experiment more with rate-setting model in future action plans.



8. Vulnerable Population and Underserved Population Definition Approval (Discussion for Possible Action) The council discussed voting to adopt the updated Vulnerable and Underserved Population Definition Marty Elquist, Department Director, The Children's Cabinet

- Marty Elquist discussed Data & Evaluation committee having primary role in definition and how approval was acquired from the Leadership committee, seeking final approval from general ECAC committee.
- Marty Elquist overviewed and read 'Definition of Vulnerable and Underserved Children' document.
- Marty Elquist need for definition and how it needs to lead to accessible and specific data to properly assess needs of the population.
- Marty Elquist discussed how the definition will lead to future action plans and communication efforts with other organizations.
- Marty Elquist reviewed different ways in which other ECAC subcommittees can utilize the definition to serve their group-specific operations, functions, and needs.
- Stephanie Vega mentioned quantification concern regarding 'lack of basic needs' for specificity.
- Rachel Stepina voiced support for definition and discussed implementation into future action plans.
- Marty Elquist proposed approval of definition, with a revisit of 'lack of basic needs' concern.
- Stephanie Vega mentioned need for race and culture data disaggregation and its relation to child experiences.
- Marty Elquist and Denise Tanata- addressed race and ethnicity considerations from previous meetings.
- Dr Linda Young recommended revisit of application for race, ethnicity, and culture data in coordination with Stephanie Vega's question.
- Marty Elquist and Tiffany Alston discussed definition and application considerations when drafting document so that 'comprehensive systems' are made while still being mindful of race, ethnicity, and culture.
- Marty Elquist recommended delay of vote and revisit to Data & Evaluation subcommittee to incorporate information from race and culture discussion.
- Abbey Bernhardt discussed individual disparities and consideration of that information into future discussions regarding the Definition.
