## Nevada 2025 Legislative Session

## Early Childhood Bill Summary

**Bills that Passed** - Although these bills were passed by the Legislature, many are still waiting to be approved by the Governor. Dates/notes indicate most recent action as listed on NELIS on June 4<sup>th</sup>.

- <u>AB212</u> Early Childhood Education Extends the "Virtual Early Childhood Family Engagement Program" and allocates \$2 million to the program.
  6/2 Passed Senate (2<sup>nd</sup> House) Pending Enrollment
- <u>AB266</u> Breastfeeding Creates a public education and awareness campaign and revises policies regarding breastfeeding in public places.
  5/30 Approved by Governor. Chapter 119
- <u>AB405</u> Community Gardens & Urban Farms Requires the Department of Agriculture to establish a program to assist in the development of community gardens and urban farms in areas with high levels of food insecurity.
   6/2 – Passed Senate (2<sup>nd</sup> House) – Sent to Enrollment
- <u>SB257</u> Autism Revises requirements for assessment of autism spectrum disorder and addresses insurance coverage for the assessment and diagnosis.
  6/2 To Enrollment
- <u>SB460</u> Education/PreK Educate Act This bill includes a large number of revisions to education programs in the state, including some additional funding for PreK and removing income eligibility requirements for PreK.
  6/2 Passed Assembly (2<sup>nd</sup> House) To Enrollment

## Bills that Failed:

- AB67 Baby Bonds Establishes a trust fund for children covered by Medicaid at birth which they could access after turning age 18.
- <u>AB185</u> Child Care Prevents HOAs (Homeowner Associations or Common-Interest Communities) from restricting owners/tenants from operating a licensed home-based child care in the community, with some limitations.
   5/29 – Enrolled & Delivered to Governor – Veto by Governor Pending

- <u>AB268</u> Universal Free Breakfast & Lunch in Schools Allocates \$43 million per year to provide grants to Nevada school districts to provide universal free breakfast and lunch.
- <u>AB297</u> Home-Visiting Programs Expands access to qualified home-visiting programs for persons who are pregnant or have recently given birth by providing Medicaid coverage for these programs.
- <u>AB340</u> Health Insurance Coverage for Screenings Requires health insurance, including Medicaid, to cover the costs for screening, assessment, and diagnosis of attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, fetal alcohol spectrum disorders, intellectual disabilities and specific learning disabilities.
- <u>SB58</u> PreK Revises eligibility for the Nevada Ready! PreK program including moving income requirement from 200% FPL to 250% FPL, and serving all 4-yearolds who have an individualized education program or who have a documented need for behavioral, social or emotional supports, regardless of income. Note: Many of these requirements were added to SB460 (see above).
- <u>SB82</u> Office of Early Childhood Systems Establishes the Office of Early Childhood Systems in the Governor's Office to coordinate and align early childhood programs and services.
- <u>SB388</u> Child Care Requires the Child Care and Development Program (child care subsidy) to eliminate the parent co-payment for some families and limit co-pays to no more than 5 percent of gross income of the family for others.
- <u>SB461</u> Child Care/Economic Development This is the Governor's bill to support economic development, which includes a tax credit for businesses who build or expand child care facilities.
