UPDATES:

Child Care Licensing is working with local jurisdictions to assist Group Care providers with coming into compliance with special use permit requirements, where applicable. To provide a reasonable opportunity for providers to complete this process, Licensing will allow existing licensed providers until the later of:

- Six (6) months from the date of this notice (6/24/2026); or
- Their next license renewal.

During this implementation period, providers are encouraged to actively work toward compliance with the requirements of their local jurisdiction. Licensing encourages providers to contact their local city or county jurisdiction to determine what requirements may apply to their operation and what steps, if any, are necessary to achieve compliance. Please note that local zoning and Special Use Permit requirements are established and enforced by local governments. Licensing cannot waive local requirements, and providers remain responsible for complying with all applicable local ordinances. Any enforcement decisions made by a city or county are independent of Child Care Licensing.

This delayed implementation period applies only to facilities that were licensed by Child Care Licensing before June 24, 2026.

Existing licensed providers will be afforded additional time to work with their local jurisdiction and demonstrate compliance with any applicable local zoning or Special Use Permit requirements. Applicants seeking a new Group Care license may be required to provide documentation demonstrating compliance with applicable local zoning, land-use, and permitting requirements before a license may be issued, consistent with NAC 432A.200.

Nevada Home Visiting continues to accept referrals for eligible families who are pregnant or have children up to age five. Services are voluntary, free, and evidence-based, providing support for healthy pregnancies, positive parenting, child development, school readiness, and family well-being.

Nevada Pyramid Model Partnership had its 15th annual End of Year Celebration and Data Review on June 18th, highlighting data and successes of Pyramid Model training, coaching, family support, and Implementation Site activities. Families who received services shared the impact of services for their families. Several implementation sites shared successes of supporting individual children with concerns about challenging behaviors, demonstrating how coaching supports for teaching effective social and emotional skills helped everyone succeed - classroom staff, children, and families.

Our Washoe County School District partners shared a resource they created that others could use, providing access to a variety of examples and tips to guide classroom implementation. Our hybrid event, with in person locations in Las Vegas and Reno and others joining online, brought together about 60 individuals statewide to reflect on and celebrate the program/school year of implementation successes.

Many programs are currently on summer break, but we still have programs that are open year round with summer programming. Plans are underway for a strong start for the new program/school year, with trainings scheduled and improvement plans being developed. Most programs/schools begin in early/mid-August, and calendars are pretty full of lots of preparation for the new year.

Supporting Professional Development Through Collaboration

- Collaborated with community partners to host a regional mini-conference focused on strengthening early childhood transitions.
- Provided educators, program leaders, paraprofessionals, developmental specialists, families, and community providers with a foundational understanding of Part C to Part B transitions, as well as Birth through 3rd Grade transitions.
- Partnered with NevAEYC's Northeast Committee to offer a Pyramid Model training during the conference, led by Janice Lee.
- Enhanced learning by providing social-emotional children's books to all conference participants, supporting the implementation of Pyramid Model practices in classrooms and programs.
- Empowering Families
- Partnered with Nevada PEP to provide a family training for parents and caregivers in Elko and surrounding rural communities.
- Increased awareness of available resources, family rights, and advocacy opportunities to better support children with diverse developmental needs.
- Partnered with The Children's Cabinet to host a First 5 Resource Event for families in Elko and surrounding rural communities.
- Helped connect families with valuable local resources and services while providing coats to families who identified a need, helping ensure children were prepared for the winter season.
